Campus Supervision

Our campus is a late start campus. On Monday's there is no Zero Period so First Period begins at 9:25 a.m. Tuesday through Friday there is Zero Period and it begins at 8:05 a.m., however too many students are arriving much earlier. There are students arriving on campus as early as 6:30 a.m., and there is no security. The Campus Monitor is not scheduled until 8:00 a.m.
