Erich Jenkins Change a Life Foundation Scholarship

Award: Up to three winners will receive \$3,000 each; a separate spirit award of \$1,000.

Requirements: For graduating C.K. McClatchy seniors. This award was created to honor the memory of Erich Jenkins who graduated from CKM in 1981. Judging criteria include: satisfactory academic record, extra-curricular activities and/or community/philanthropic involvement, a passion for making a difference in the lives of others, positive attitude and enthusiasm. Application must include a 750-word essay, 2 letters of recommendation, optional supporting materials pertaining to achievements/activities.

Deadline: March 28, 2008. Finalists will be interviewed at CKM on April 24, 2008.

Jo Anne Marquardt(JAM) Hope, Empower, Love, and Peace(HELP)

Award: \$1,000

Requirements: For graduating seniors from C.K. McClatchy who will be entering Sac State for Fall 2008. Must be first generation in family to attend college with a 2.8 GPA for junior and senior years in high school. Full-time enrollment and financial need are required at time of award. Must submit letter of recommendation and a personal statement. Deadline: March 14, 2008

2008 Hispanic Heritage Youth Awards

Award: Awards range from \$1,000 to \$3,000

Requirements: For graduating seniors planning to enroll as full-time college students in the fall. Must be a citizen or permanent resident of the U.S. at the time of application. Must be of Hispanic heritage with a 3.0 GPA and be willing to travel to the award ceremony at your own expense. Other selection criteria include accomplishments in the community. All students must apply online at www.hispanicheritage.org.

Deadline: March 14, 2008

Friends of the California State Fair Scholarship Program

Award: 32 scholarships, ranging from \$250 to \$1,500 with the outstanding candidate receiving an additional \$5,000 from the Ironstone Concours Foundation.

Requirements: For graduating seniors. Preference will be given to individuals with broad personal, civic and academic experience. Must have a minimum 3.0 GPA and submit a 2-page personal statement and letters of recommendation. Other criteria include personal commitment and goals, leadership potential.

Deadline: March 21, 2008

The Bustos/Lopez Family Scholarship 2008/Sacramento Region Community Foundation

Award: \$5,000 over a 4-year period provided all requirements are met each semester.

Requirements: For a graduating Hispanic senior with a minimum 3.0 GPA with the desire and perseverance to succeed. Must enroll full-time at a 4-year college or university. Other requirements include 2 letters of recommendation and a detailed self-description essay.

Deadline: April 7, 2008

The Rosenwald "Robbie" Robertson Scholarship/Sacramento Area Black Caucus, Inc.

Award: Two awards of \$500

Requirements: For **one African American male and one female** graduate from a **Sacramento** area high school. Applicants must demonstrate a record of service to the African American community in addition to having records of academic achievement and leadership.

Deadline: **April 7, 2008**

The Sacramento Taiwanese Cultural Foundation Scholarship

Award: Two \$1,000 awards

Requirements: For **any** graduating senior who will enroll in a **4-year** college or university in the fall. Applicants must demonstrate academic dedication (3.0 GPA), financial need, and be a U.S. citizen. The application must include an essay stating career goals and community service, letter of recommendation, and copy of parent's tax return.

Deadline: **April 15, 2008**

Sacramento Police Officers Association Memorial Scholarship Fund

Award: \$1,000, in the memory of Officer William (Bill) Bean, Jr.

Requirements: Must have a 3.0 GPA, reside in, or attend a school located within the **City of Sacramento**, and be a U.S. citizen or legal U.S. resident. Must also prepare a 500-word essay stating his/her goals. The scholarship is not limited to a choice of vocation.

Deadline: **April 18, 2008**

The Diane Dawson Memorial Scholarship

Award: Ranges from \$500 to \$1,500, may be renewable

Requirements: For a graduating senior in the **Sacramento** or Denver area with a parent who has terminal cancer or other terminal illness, or has lost a parent to a terminal disease during their tenure in high school. Must have minimum 2.5 GPA. Selection based on financial need, student potential and merit, personal essay, letters of recommendation, extracurricular activities, and unusual circumstances.

Deadline: **April 21, 2008**

Centro Dos Scholarship Fund

Award: Four \$500 awards

Requirements: For graduating seniors interested in furthering his/her education in the **field of art**. Because this is a nomination process, applicants must return application to the Career Center.

Deadline: **April 25, 2008** - to Mrs. Milton in the Career Center.

Les Belles Artes Club, Inc. Annual Scholarship

Award: not stated

Requirements: For graduating seniors planning to pursue **studies in the arts** (sculpture, painting, graphics, photography, design, architecture, drama, music, dance, music composition). Preference will be given to Black American applicants. The application includes a one-page personal statement.

Deadline: **May 1, 2008**

Sacramento Chapter of Physicians for Social Responsibility 2008 Essay Contest

Award: A total of \$10,250 in scholarships will be awarded to the top 10 contestants.

Requirements: A 500-word on a select topic "War is a racket...in which the profits are reckoned in dollars and the losses in lives." For seniors in Sacramento and surrounding counties.

Deadline: March 5, 2008

The Air Force Association Chapter 116 of Sacramento

Award: not stated (last year, \$1,000)

Requirements: Must be pursuing a degree in engineering, mathematics, science, technology. Must have a 3.0 GPA, SAT of 1800 or ACT of 22, demonstrate school/community involvement, leadership.

Deadline: March 14, 2008

Italian Catholic Federation Scholarship 2008

Award: \$400 - may be renewable

Requirements: Must be Catholic, Italian descent, with a 3.2 GPA, and demonstrate financial need, leadership, extracurricular activities, plans for the future.

Deadline: March 15, 2008

Sacramento Post of the Society of American Military Engineers(SAME) 2008 Scholarship

Award: Range from \$1,000 to \$2,000

Requirements: Must be interested in pursuing a degree in engineering, science, or related technical disciplines and demonstrate academic performance, school/community activities, future goals.

Deadline: March 15, 2008

Land Park Lions Club/Ted Econome Memorial Scholarship

Award: \$1,000

Requirements: For seniors attending high school in the Land Park area. Selection is based on scholarship, community/school activities, personal essay, commitment to career goals, financial need.

Deadline: March 20, 2008
