**The Violet Richardson Award of Soroptimist International - Sacramento South**

**Award:** Local awards range from \$200 to \$500. Club-level winners then become eligible for one of 28 \$1,000 awards, plus a donation to the charitable organization of their choice.

**Requirements:** This is a **VOLUNTEER ACTION** award. Transcripts are not a requirement. **For young women ages 14-17** who make the community and world a better place through volunteer efforts. A 750-word essay is also required.

**Deadline:** **December 1, 2007**

**MetroPCS Community Scholars Program**

**Award:** \$1,000 - 15 scholarships in the Sacramento/Stockton area.

**Requirements:** For seniors attending high school in eleven counties, including Sacramento and who plan to enroll full-time at an accredited 2-or 4-year college or university. Emphasis will be given to students who have demonstrated exceptional involvement in volunteerism and community service. Other criteria include a minimum 3.0 GPA, participation in school activities, honors, work experience, statement of goals and aspirations, unusual personal or family circumstances, and letters of recommendation. **Deadline:** **November 29, 2007**

**The 2008 Burger King Scholars Program**

**Award:** \$1,000 - up to 700 scholarships awarded throughout the U.S., Canada, and Puerto Rico.

**Requirements:** For seniors who have a minimum 2.5 GPA, work part-time an average of 15 hours per week/40 weeks per year, are actively involved in community service activities, demonstrate financial need and who plan to enroll in an accredited 2 or 4-year college, university or vocational/technical school in the fall. **Applications available on-line only** Oct. 15, 2007 - Feb. 15, 2008 at [www.bk.com/scholars](http://www.bk.com/scholars).

**U.S. Bank Internet Scholarship Program**

**Award:** up to thirty \$1,000 scholarships awarded in a random drawing process

### **The Air Force Association Chapter 116 of Sacramento**

**Award:** not stated

**Requirements:** Must be a graduating senior from the Sacramento region, accepted or enrolled in an accredited 4-year college or university on a full-time basis starting in the fall. Must be pursuing a degree program related to aerospace studies such as engineering, mathematics, science or technology or other programs if they support or complement the needs of the military. Must have a minimum 3.0 GPA and a SAT of 1800 or ACT of 22. Other selection criteria include leadership achievements, community involvement, extra-curricular activities, and a personal essay.

**Deadline:** **March 14, 2008**

### **The Christermon Foundation Beverage Industry College Scholarship Program**

**Award:** Range from \$2,000 to \$5,000

**Requirements:** For **California** high school graduating seniors who will attend a **four-year** university fall semester 2008 and whose parents and /or grandparents are proprietors of, or employed by an individual or corporation holding a California liquor license. This includes restaurants, retailers, distributors, airlines, suppliers, hotels, wineries, breweries, etc. Other criteria include the student's extra-curricular high school involvement. ### **Schwab Rosenhouse Memorial Scholarship Program**

**Award:** Variable scholarship grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$3,500

**Requirements:** For students who live in the four counties in and around the Sacramento area and who **plan to enroll at a college or university, community college, or an accredited vocational/technical institution located within a 100-mile radius of Sacramento**. Selection is based on academic record, school and community activities, family profile, future goals, financial need, letters of recommendation. ### **The Fashion Institute of Design & Merchandising National Scholarship Competition**

**Award:** 6 students will be awarded a 1-year scholarship to FIDM for tuition, fees, books, supplies.

**Requirements:** Must demonstrate talent and interest in Fashion Design, Visual Communications, Interior Design, Digital Media, Fashion Merchandising, or Graphic Design.

**Deadline:** **April 30, 2008**

### **Gates Millennium Scholars Program 2008**

Award: Financial support for **the entire cost** of an undergraduate education in any academic discipline and graduate school funding in designated fields. One thousand students will be selected.

Requirements: For outstanding **low-income African American, American Indian/Alaska Natives, Asian Pacific Islander American, and Hispanic American students**. Must be a citizen, legal permanent resident or national of the U.S. Must have a minimum 3.3 GPA with demonstrated leadership abilities through participation in community service, extra-curricular or other activities and must meet the Federal Pell Grant eligibility criteria. It is recommended that forms be submitted online at [www.gmsp.org](http://www.gmsp.org) (a few are available in the Career Center).

Deadline: For online submissions the deadline is **January 11, 2008**. Paper submissions must be postmarked no later than **December 31, 2007**.

### **The California Association of Collectors Educational Scholarship Foundation**

Award: Three winners: First Place: \$2,500, Second Place: \$2,000, Third Place: \$1,500

Requirements: For **California** seniors to use at any accredited college, university, or vocational school. The scholarship is based upon a simple one-page application and a 3-4-page essay on "Importance of Establishing and Maintaining Good Credit during Your College Years".
